372 pp (first edition, paperback) Victor Lee (original cover) Sammy Yuen (new cover) Merchant of Death is the first book in Pendragon Adventures. It is located mainly in The Dendron, and otherwise installed in the fictional town of Stony Brook, Connecticut on the Second Earth. The contents of Bobby Pendragon's show are seemingly a normal 14-year-old boy. He has a family, a house, and even Marley, his favorite dog. But there's something special about Bobby. He's going to save the world. And not only the Earth, as we know it. Bobby is gradually beginning to realize that life in space is not quite what he thought it was. And before he can object, he is swept into an alternate dimension known as Tendron, a territory inhabited by strange creatures ruled by a magical tyrant, and suffers from a dangerous revolution. If Bobby wants to see his family again, he will have to accept his role as savior and accept it from the bottom of his heart. Because, as he's about to discover, Denduron is just the beginning.... - Blurb on the back of the Merchant of Death magazine plot

#1 Story begins when Bobby is late for his county semifinal basketball game. He opens the door to leave and finds Courtney Chetwynde, his crush from elementary school. She confesses her feelings for him, and they kiss. Bobby is ripped from this happy moment by his uncle Press, who tells him some people need his help and takes him to an abandoned subway station. At the subway station, Bobby sees for the first time The Saint Dane, who took the form of a city policeman. He uses mind control to kill a homeless man and then turns back into his usual form. Bobby runs away like Saint Dane and presses to shoot each other. He fluids up to Dendron alone and finds himself on top of a snow-covered mountain. When the Press gets to Dendron, he tells Bobby a little bit about being a Traveler and a flume. They have to go away quickly to avoid the jokes, so they take the sledge down the mountain. The jokes haunt them and they crash into the bottom of the mountain. Bobby sees the Press kidnap the knights on horseback, and then loses to the side. Second Earth Mark tries to sleep one night when a woman (who later found out to be Wasp) enters his bedroom and gives him a ring, saying it's from Bobby. The wasp uses the Traveler's conviction to get him to sleep before he can ask any questions. The next day, Mark goes to school hoping to talk to Bobby, but he's not there. Other students ask Mark why Bobby missed the game, but Mark has no answer. The Ring Osa gave him starts twitching, so Mark runs to the bathroom and sees him deliver the magazine for the first time. After reading part of the magazine, he runs to the gym to find Courtney. She confirms that she kissed Bobby and saw his uncle Press last night. Mark asks her to go with him to Bobby's house, and when they arrive, they discover that his entire house is missing. Mark Courtney read the diary, and she does. Courtney's not story at first, but she's ready to help Mark figure out what happened to Bobby and his family. They call his parents' jobs and his sister's school, but they all say they didn't come that day. Mark and Courtney decide to go to the police, who think they are playing a prank because the Pendragons have never been in their system. Before they have the opportunity to convince them to help, however, the ring supplies another magazine. In #2, bobby wakes up in a hut in the village of Milago. He meets Laura and Osa, who presumably led him to the hut. Wasp uses his powers to heal Bobby's wounds. Bobby leaves the hut and encounters Figgis, who unsuccessfully tries to sell him a sweater. Wasp, Lore and Bobby walk around the village, while Osa tells Bobby about the power of the Traveler to hear all languages as his own. She also tells him that Milago is oppressed by Bedoowan and is seen as slaves. The group then hears drums that signal the handover ceremony, where one of the miners weighs in against a daytime glaze catch to see if they are booby-trapped enough. The group runs back to the village to watch. Bobby quickly realizes that Mallos, The Bedouin, who coordinates the ceremony, is actually Saint Dane. Mallos makes it impossible for miners to match the weight of the man, and the miner is killed by being pushed down the mine. Seeing the horror, Bobby begins to cry and scream, asking Wasa why they did not try to save him. The wasp tells him they can't or they'll be punished. Bobby insists that they still have to do something, and Osa says that Milago plans to rebel against Bedowan, and that Bobby is going to help them. Bobby refuses, deciding that he is going to fluid back home the first chance he gets. Wasp later asks Bobby if there is anyone at home whom he trusts above all else. He tells her about Mark. Then Wasp tells him to start writing his diaries. After #1 the magazine, Wasp shows him how to send it with the Traveler's Ring. Bobby asks a few questions about how the ring works, but Wasp doesn't give him many answers. She walks away, telling Bobby that there's a stream where he can swim if he wants to. He again encounters Figgis, walking to the stream, which gives him a cryptic message about how so is the way. On the stream, Bobby hears music and goes to explore, finding Laura humming to herself while washing clothes. He does not interact with her for fear of attack. He's standing there for a while until he hears someone who turns out to be a bedain knight. Bobby quickly goes crazy, tackling Loor and sending them both into the river. After rescuing her from the rapids, Bobby expects praise from Loor, but is instead scolded for saving them from Alder, a traveller from Dendron. Alder finds them again and tells Bobby that they expected him to lead the revolution against Bedowan. Bobby refuses, saying he has no idea how to do it. Alder also tells them that the press is planning the next day. Lore is furious, telling Bobby that it's time for him to know the truth. She will take him back to Osu and tell her that he needs to see the mines. In the mines, Bobby sees dozens of miners lying on the ground looking sick. The wasp tells him that miners die from breathing with toxic gas, which is released by icing. When Bobby asks why she showed him this, Wasp says he should have seen how desperate the situation is for Milago. Bobby starts running away, saying he is going home, but before he can get away there is an explosion in one of the tunnels. He keeps an eye on what the miners are doing, but they don't seem to have an emergency plan. He asks Osu how often they have such explosions, but Osa tells him that she does not know what an explosion is, and has never seen anything like it on Denduron. Bobby sees Rellin, the chief miner, emerging from the smoking tunnel and then starts laughing. Bobby does not know what to do with it, Bobby and Wasp leave the mine and find that the dead miner was shot by an arrow. They try to escape, but a group of Bedowan knights stops them and says they are here for Bobby's sake. The fight follows, with Loor appearing and helping defeat the Knights. The wasp orders Laura to hide Bobby, and Luhr reluctantly obeys, taking Bobby to the Forest. The wasp seems to defeat the knights alone, but knights with bows and arrows hid in the trees. They shoot Ose in the back. Luhr and Bobby run away from the knights and return to see Osu when she is safe. The wasp gives Bobby the ring she used before and then dies. Lore tells Bobby that he is selfish and unreliable, and therefore cannot lead the revolution, and that she is taking him home tomorrow. Bobby realizes that she is right, and that he needs to at least try to save the Press. He tells Mark that he needs help, and that he has attached a note with instructions on what to do. Second Earth Mark and Courtney read a magazine #2 on the sidewalk in front of the police station, but they don't finish it because the police officer they spoke to earlier asks them to go inside and talk to him. He takes them to Captain Hirsch, who says he believes Mark and Courtney because he knew the Pendragons. He asks them if they have anything else that they can tell him about where Bobby and his family can be, and they say no, deciding to keep the logs to themselves. They leave the police station and attack Andy Mitchell, who picks up Mark's backpack containing Bobby's diaries and threatens to throw him down the drain. Courtney stands in front of a bully. After Andy leaves, Mark and Courtney decide to finish the magazine in Courtney's house. After graduating from the magazine, Mark and Courtney read a note to see that Bobby wanted them to get him something from The Second Earth. They collect items and meet the next day. They try to use the ring to send things, but it doesn't work, so they go to the subway. They find the flume and like Bobby flume. They're all cuddling, Bobby asks. Courtney is there, and Mark admits that he shared magazines with her. Mark and Courtney try to convince Bobby to stay, but he tells them he can't leave the press there when he dies. He returns to Tendron, and Mark's ring is activated almost immediately after he has left. Characters of the main characters Bobby Pendragon - the main character. He writes diaries to send to his best friends Mark Diamond and Courtney Chetwind. Press Tilton is Bobby's uncle and a traveler from the Second Earth in front of him. Mark Diamond is Bobby's best friend who takes care of his diaries. Courtney Chetwind - a close friend of Bobby and a lover, with whom Mark shares magazines. Loor - Traveller from zada. She's the warrior who helps defeat St. Dane at Tendron. Alder is a traveller from Dendron. He is a Bedowan knight who helps defeat St. Dane at Dendurone. Wasp is Laura's mother and the Traveller from zada in front of her. She's a warrior, just like her daughter. She dies in this book, protecting Bobby from the Knights of Bedouin. The Holy Dane is an antagonist who tries to make Dendurin fall into chaos. Rellin is the main miner of Milago, who begins the revolution against Bedoowan, Figgis - Milago merchant. At the end of the book he is revealed as a holy Dane, and that the real Figgis died when he discovered so. The small characters of the queen Kagan - the ruler of Bedoowan. Mallos is an adviser to the queen, who quickly revealed that the holy Dane. Sergeant D'Angelo and Captain Hirsch are police officers who help Mark and Courtney as they go to them about the disappearance of Pendragon. Andy Mitchell - a bully in a children's school, who specifically antagonizes Mark. Dedication to Evander.
